CLARIFICATION OF THE NHA RULES FOR MEMBERSHIP

The Nauset Heights Association (NHA) is an association of property owners within the Nauset Heights area.

Ownership of a property on Nauset Heights entitles the owner(s) to join the Nauset Heights Association (NHA) by way of payment to the NHA of the standard dues. If two or more individuals, other than husband and wife, hold title to a property, each such owner who wishes to enjoy the benefits of membership, as outlined below, upon payment of dues, shall become a member.

The benefits of membership include attendance at all NHA meetings and social events, use of the NHA stairs to the beach, and inclusion in the NHA Directory.

Each property on Nauset Heights is entitled to one vote at meetings of the NHA, whether or not two or more individuals hold title to the property, so long as at least one owner has paid the required dues for that property. Each adult offspring of a member may join the NHA, and upon paying the required dues, shall become a member entitled to full benefits.

Otherwise, offspring, minor or adult, and guests of a



member shall be allowed use of the NHA stairs to the beach and may attend all NHA social events upon paying any fee required for each such event.

NAUSET HEIGHTS AUTHORAND BOARD MEMBER DONATES BOOK SALES MONEYTO NHA

Stephen A. Hopkins, one of the NHA directors, has written a book entitled *Memoirs of a Cape Codder*. Steve was born in Eastham and grew up in East Orleans where generations of his family have lived continuously since 1640.



Steve's book contains 59 stories, and the first 26 stories describe what it was like growing up in Orleans from the late thirties through the early 1950's. There is also a chapter in the book with six stories by his boyhood friend, Sam Sherman, recounting humorous activities he engaged in as a boy in that same time frame. These stories provide the reader with an

historic view into what life was like for youngsters growing up on the Cape in those years.

The remaining stories in the book describe Steve's life experiences after he left Cape Cod, first attending college, his two years in the Army in Germany, then his 36 years as a trial lawyer in Boston, finally his activities in retirement, especially in Anguilla, the winter home for Steve and his wife, Sylvia.

In the chapter on his work as a trial lawyer, Steve describes some of the more unusual cases he handled, beginning with small trials as a fledging attorney, moving to his first jury trial, and on to the high drama of receiving a jury verdict after a hard fought lengthy trial. These stories provide an insight into the workings of our justice system and would be particularly interesting to those who are thinking about a law career.



Steve has eight copies of the book, available on a "first come first served" basis. The book is priced at \$15.00, and proceeds from sales will be donated to NHA.
